Special Person of the Week!

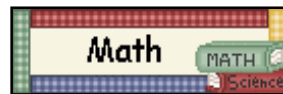
Steffahn!



Steffahn is a second grader and his favorite subject in school is math. He likes to talk to his friends in his spare time, and wants to be a vet when he grows up because he likes animals. His two buddies, Bria & Shannon "Steffahn is a nice friends who is smart. He's really good at math." He is!!!



This week, we will work on two strategies for figuring out new words: Stretchy Snake and Lips the Fish. Stretchy reminds readers to stretch out each sound or syllable. To practice at home first graders should pronounce each sound in a word (i.e. b-a-t), and second graders can break words into syllables (i.e. Oc-to-ber). Lips the Fish helps readers figure out new words by putting the first sound or sounds in your mouth. Students often have words in their listening vocabulary, but have not yet seen them in print. To help at home, you can give your child the first sounds of words and then let them guess the word with hints.



While we continue to work on addition properties for both levels, we will be working with geometry for the next several weeks. First graders will be working on learning shapes and patterns, while second grade students will be learning about solid figures, line segments, and measuring the perimeter of shapes. This unit is always a kid favorite!
